Question 1:

Class readings and seminar discussions highlighted the multiple shifts that occurred in Latin America (and outside the region) in the recent past. Identify these transformations to discuss how they reshaped various understandings regarding the nature and role of both state and civil society and to describe the main features of the emerging reconfiguration of the state-civil society relationship.

Question 2:

The World Bank identifies social capital as the "missing link in development" and advocates the idea that high levels of social capital can generate good government and economic development. As a result, it recommends that development interventions should seek to strengthen civil society by enhancing local social participation, organization, and communication. Does this approach offer greater opportunities for civil society organizations to act "agents of social transformation"? Why, or why not?

Instructions:

- Answers must be analytical rather than descriptive and must be organized around a clear argument (thesis statement) addressing the essay question. The discussion must be framed by the issues and concepts discussed in the course.
- Answers must use proper academic references and include a bibliography to acknowledge the sources used in preparing the essay. The bibliography should only include the sources cited in the answers. The use of quotations should be kept to a minimum. No outside sources can be used.
