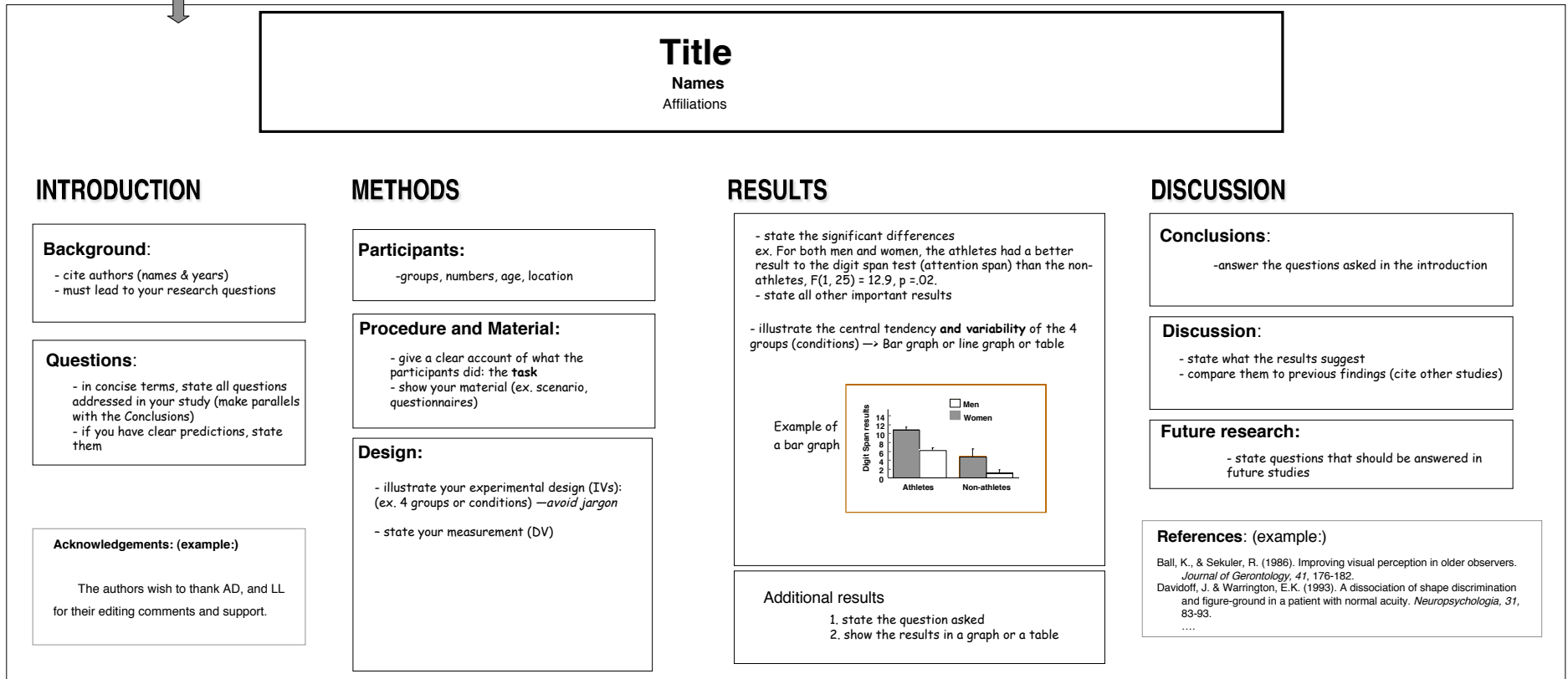


# How to prepare & "give" a poster

Content of your poster  
(with important details to consider within each section)



## Notes

The exact layout of your poster is up to you, however, there are important points to consider.

While preparing a poster:

- Always consider who your audience will be; do not use technical jargon if it is meaningless to them (or make sure that you explain it).
- Always consider the measurement on the board on which you will post your poster. Here at Glendon the boards are 36 inches high and 48 inches wide (12'-24'-12' panels); light cardboards can be posted on it.
- Make sure that plan how to post your poster (e.g. pins, gum).

Tips:

- Do not use font smaller than 18 points.
- Use point forms: be clear and concise.
- You will be required to give a "tour" of your poster; make sure that your poster will help you guide the audience through your study.
- Practice giving your tour before finishing up your poster; adjust accordingly.
