HOW DO I APPLY FOR DISTANCE EDUCATION COURSES?

To apply to a degree or certificate program, or as a visiting student, you may refer to the York University Admissions Web site at www.yorku.ca/admissions, where you will find detailed admissions information and online application procedures. Once you are admitted, you may enrol for courses by using the online Registration and Enrolment Module available at www.registrar.yorku.ca. The York University course timetable and enrolment guide are also available on this Web site.

INTERNET AND CORRESPONDENCE COURSES

Enjoy the flexibility of studying at your own pace with Internet and Correspondence courses. You can learn from the convenience of your home or office anywhere in the world. Distance courses use the same textbooks and materials and cover the same course content as in-class sections. These courses count towards your degree or certificate program in exactly the same way as in-class courses. You can alleviate your on-campus schedule by mixing your in-class courses

with Internet and Correspondence courses. You can also take courses to complete a program entirely by distance.

MIXED-MODE COURSES: IN CLASS & INTERNET

Atkinson offers a Mixed-Mode course format – approximately half in-class and half Internet. This reduces your on-campus visits by almost fifty percent. The course instructor will inform you of the mandatory on-campus class schedule and the online component at the beginning of the term.
