All Arts and Atkinson programs and courses, except mathematics, computer science and computer security, will be switched to LA&PS. Mathematics, computer science and computer security programs will be switched to the Faculty of Science and Engineering (FSE).</p> <p>Before enrolling: You should read through the current Enrolment Guide to ensure that you are fully aware of the various course add/drop and start/end dates, and the financial impact of enrolling in and dropping courses.
