Toronto CMA: Census Metropolitan Area of Toronto

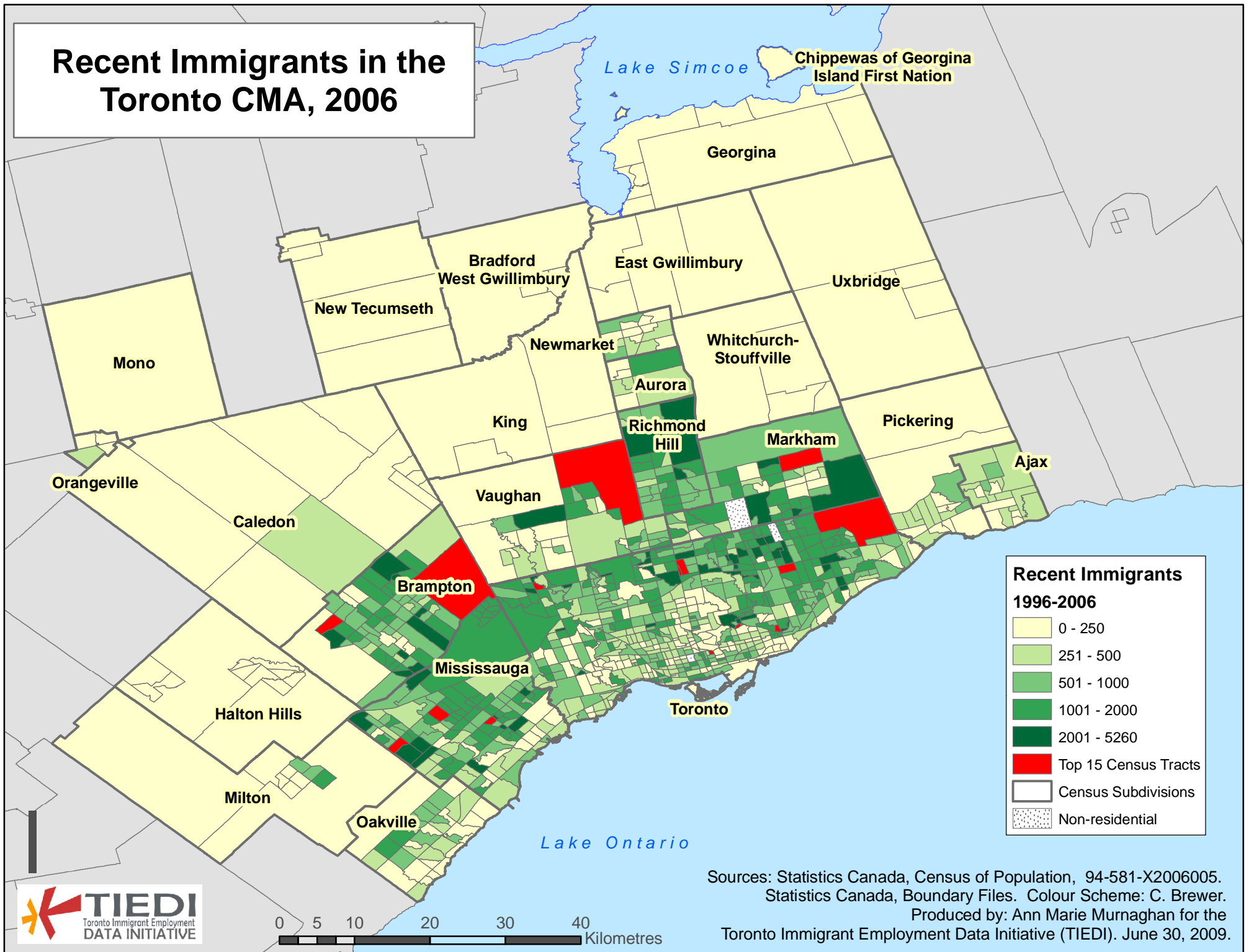
