

# Fact sheet 09-13

**QUESTION:** What is the most recent data available on the number of newcomers arriving in the Toronto CMA and planning to find work as managers or supervisors?

### ANSWER:

The number of immigrants planning to settle in Toronto and work as managers or supervisors doubled between 2000 and 2005.

Among immigrants landing in 2005, planning to settle in Ontario and work as managers or supervisors, 77.9% plan to work as middle managers (3002 out of 3852). Among middle managers, immigrants planning to settle in Ontario were more likely to plan to work as Sales, Marketing and Advertising Managers (739), Financial Managers (523), and Banking, Credit and Other Investment Managers (384).

15.2% of immigrants planning to settle in Ontario were planning to work as supervisors. Among them, 125 were planning to work as Contractors and Supervisors, Mechanic Trades, and 88 were planning to work as Farmers and Farm Managers.

Finally, 6.8% of immigrants planning to work as managers or supervisors were planning to work as senior managers. Among them, 102 were planning to work as senior managers in the financial, communications and other business services.

The more recent data available is for 2005.

Immigrants were asked on arrival to Canada what was their intended occupation and their city of destination. Data do not take into account subsequent moves to or from Toronto as well as occupational changes.

#### Management Occupations

Management occupations present a special problem for reliable coding of occupational survey responses. In many cases there is little indication of the level of responsibility, the size of the enterprise or division managed, or the field of specialization.

To be of practical use, a classification of managers must be a compromise between the theoretically optimal and the practical solutions.

Senior management occupations (in major group 00) have been divided on the basis of industry of employment into five unit groups. The breakdown was originally made according to the *Standard Industrial Classification* (SIC) and was changed in this revision to conform to the *North American Industry Classification System* (NAICS).

*Middle and Other Management Occupations* are divided into 16 minor groups and 38 unit groups on the basis of specialization (e.g., *Purchasing Managers*) or industry of employment (e.g., *Postal and Courier Services Managers*). In certain cases (e.g., *Transportation Managers*) groups defined by industry also contain managers in that specialization regardless of their industry of employment. The breakdown by industry corresponds to groups in the NAICS.

Management occupations have not been assigned to a skill level category. It is recognized that there is a range of acceptable educational and training requirements for managerial occupations.

#### **Supervisors**

Supervisors and foremen/women have generally been classified in skill level B. In most cases, professional and technical occupations are supervised by managerial or professional personnel respectively. However, where supervisors are identified for professional and technical groups, they are generally classified in the same unit groups as the occupations supervised.

Supervisors in the following occupational categories have been classified in supervisor unit groups or minor groups separate from the workers supervised:

o clerical and administrative occupations





- o nursing occupations
- sales and service occupations
- o trades and transport and equipment operators
- o occupations in primary industry
- o occupations unique to processing, manufacturing and utilities.


Most minor and unit groups in the occupational categories listed above have a corresponding supervisory group. Occasionally, as in minor group 626 *Police Officers and Firefighters*, supervision is provided by managers and there is no corresponding supervisory group in major group 62.

### **DEFINITIONS:**

Toronto CMA: Census Metropolitan Area of Toronto

The Toronto CMA is the grey-shaded area in the map below. It includes the City of Toronto, York Region, Peel Region and parts of Halton and Durham Regions. Other municipalities, such as New Tecumseth in southern Simcoe County and Mono Township in Dufferin County are also included in the Toronto CMA.
