The majority of self-employed immigrants and non-immigrants are between the ages of 35-59 years old. In the Toronto CMA, self-employed immigrants tend to be slightly older than non-immigrants, with more immigrants being self-employed into their late 50s and early 60s than Canadian-born.

Self-employed immigrants are more likely to have children than non-immigrants. In the Toronto CMA, 72.8% of self-employed immigrant women had at least one child, compared to 58.1% of non-immigrant women.

Industry among self-employed varies by gender. Self-employed immigrant men in Toronto were more likely to work in construction (19%) and professional, scientific and technical services (18.6%), compared to 17.4% of self-employed immigrant women working in health care and social assistance, 17.2% in professional, scientific and technical services and 14.8% in other services (see definition of other services at: http://stds.statcan.gc.ca/naics-scian/2002/ts-rt-eng.asp?criteria=81).

More than a fifth of self-employed immigrants in Toronto work as professionals (21.9% of women and 23.3% of men). Immigrant women are also working as intermediate sales and service personnel (15.4%) and semi-professional and technicians (15.3%), while immigrant men work as managers (17.1%) and skilled crafts and trades workers (15.4%).

NOTES:

Self-employed: Includes persons 15 years of age and over who worked since January 1, 2005, and for whom the job reported consisted mainly of operating a business, farm or professional practice, alone or in partnership. Self-employed persons who reported their farm or business as incorporated can be included with paid workers in certain types of analysis.

The data included in this fact sheet include self-employed with and without paid help (not incorporated).

Totals may differ due to weighting and/or respondents not answering every question.
