Working Within the TIEDI Model: Research Assistant Experiences

- Chance to learn opportunities and limitations of data liberation
 - Making data accessible
 - Drawing research questions from community need
 - Learning about persistent data gaps
 - Navigating multiple stakeholders' needs

Working Within the TIEDI Model: Research Assistant Experiences

- Exposure to research relationships and accountability
 - Learning how to bring community groups together to discuss research results
 - Seeing the extent to which power dynamics persist
 - Experiencing the excitement and frustration of community groups

Working Within the TIEDI Model: Research Assistant Experiences

- Opportunity to build academic and activist connections
 - Networking at Roundtable sessions
 - Discussing research needs and feedback
 - Using the research and experience that community groups hold for activist purposes

Moving Forward: Student Roles

- Building valuable relationships with partners
 - Focused outreach programs
 - RAs as participant observers
 - Integrating RAs' community, activist experiences
 - Create research opportunities within community groups and agencies

Relationships and Accountability in Our Research: Conclusion


- TIEDI's model has produced many potential capacities for collaboration and data liberation


