

## numeric panic!

- related conditions are numerophobia, arithmophobia, statistophobia
- in librarians, a condition brought on by a request for a statistical fact, figure, table or data
- symptoms include
  - a blank mind
  - feeling of a clenched fist in your stomach
  - urge to run from the reference desk

## how to deal with numeric panic?

- ask the right questions
- search the right sources
- spread it around!
  - know who to turn to for help
  - train colleagues so the load doesn't fall only on you

### what are data?

- facts or figures from which conclusions can be drawn
- numeric files created and organized
  - for analysis, or to create a new table
- includes geographic data
  - (to make maps)

## what are statistics?

 type of information obtained through mathematical operations on numerical data

- statistics are processed data, or data that have been analyzed in some way
- generally used to support an argument or position in a study or report

## statistics

 in print form, typically found in statistical abstracts, census and other government publications (monograph or serial)

 in digital form, found on CD-ROM or in online databases

### data vs. statistics

- difference between looking at a photograph and taking the photograph yourself
- statistics are like a photograph or postcard
  - a captured image of the data chosen by someone else
- data are like the view through a camera
  - you choose the view you want

- data that have been grouped or summarized in some way
  - e.g., by geography or age group
- boundary between aggregate data and statistics sometimes blurry

## aggregate data structure

### time

 e.g., time series data from CANSIM, Labour Force Historical Review, multiple Census years

### geography

- e.g., Census data
- neighbourhood --> national

### social content

e.g., injury data from Health Indicators

### microdata

- unsummarized data
  - often samples of actual responses to surveys
- two types of microdata files
  - master file -- raw data, usually directly available only to STC employees and authorized researchers
  - PUMF (public-use microdata file) -anonymized version of master file







## Canadian Community Health Survey, Public Use Microdata File

2000-2001

The Public Use Microdata File from the Canadian Community Health Survey (CCHS), 2000-2001 is now available. Data were collected from over 130,000 respondents, aged 12 or older, residing in households across all provinces and territories.

The Public Use Microdata File from the 2000-2001 CCHS provides data for 106 health regions or combined health regions across Canada. It comes on CD-ROM, with a built-in Beyond 20/20 application, and includes information on a wide range of topics, including alcohol consumption and dependence, chronic health conditions, fruit and vegetable consumption, general health, use of health services, height and weight, injuries, physical activity, restriction of activities and smoking. It also provides information on the socio-demographic characteristics, the income and the labour force characteristics of the population.

Information on methods and data quality available in the Integrated Meta Data Base: survey number 3226.

This product is available free of charge to public organizations in the health sector for research and non-commercial purposes.

The initial results from the CCHS 2000-2001 were released in <u>The Daily</u> on May 8, 2002. Several articles based on these data and containing detailed analysis have also been published in <u>Health reports</u> (82-003-XIE, \$15/\$44; 82-003-XPE, \$20/\$58). Many indicators are also available in <u>Health indicators</u> (82-221-XIE, free).


### Canadian Community Health Survey: A first look

2000/01

Although the proportion of people who are active in their leisure time has grown, the proportion who are obese has also increased, according to new results from the Canadian Community Health Survey (CCHS). This survey provides a wealth of data on Canadians' health status, risk factors, and health care use. This release provides links to a number of maps and tables with additional data.

CCHS data show that from 1994/95 to 2000/01, the number of obese Canadians aged 20 to 64 grew by 24% (or more than 500,000 to almost 2.8 million). These individuals represented about 15% of the adult population, or one out of every seven people, up from 13% six years earlier.


## CANSIM

- premier source of Canadian time-series data
- available through
  - subscription via UofT (DLI only)
  - E-STAT (educational institutions, DLI & DSP)
  - STC same interface as E-STAT, but updated continously; \$3/time series

# E-STAT

- intended for use by education community, and DSP libraries
- provides "free" access to CANSIM
  - CANSIM on E-STAT only updated once a year
- census data from 1986-2001, and selected censuses from 1665-1871
- data can be mapped/exported

# map generated in E-STAT




## 2001 Census
