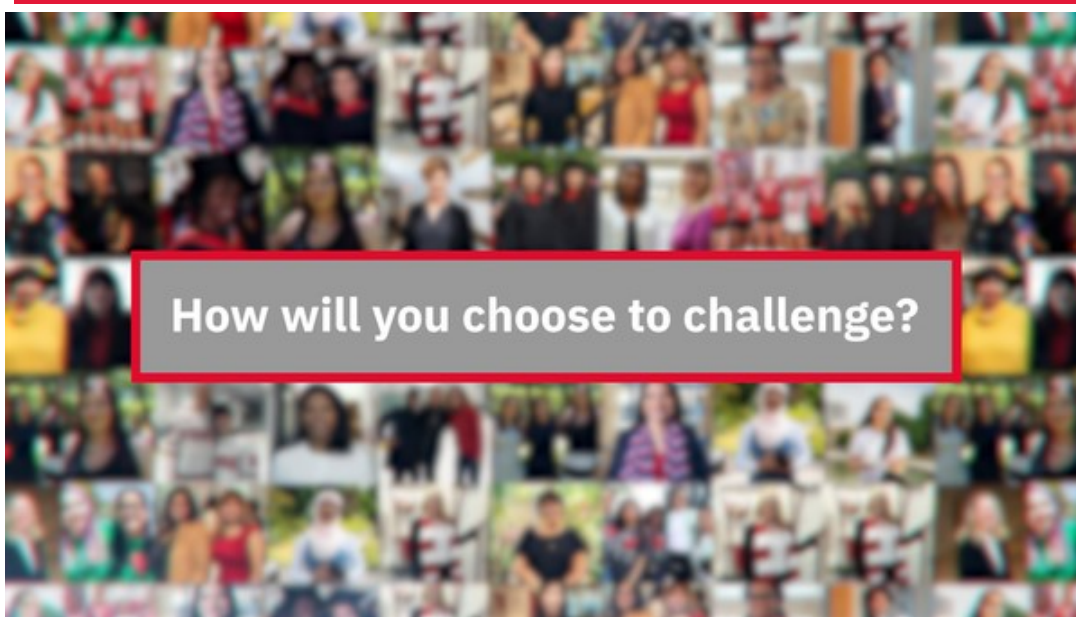


## YORK U **ALUMNI NEWS**
