

## York University's Mask or Face Covering Protocol

All persons entering an indoor space on York University property, including all campuses, work sites and satellite offices, are required to wear a mask or face covering in a manner that covers their mouth, nose and chin when entering and for the duration of their stay, unless an exemption applies. Indoor spaces include, but are not limited to classrooms, administrative buildings, offices, meeting rooms, common areas in all residences, washrooms, corridors and elevators.

## Exemptions

There are exemptions from the requirement to wear a mask or face covering within indoor spaces. Some of the exemptions relevant to the University community includes:

- children under two years of age;
- persons performing or rehearsing in a film or television production or in a concert, artistic event, theatrical performance or other performance as approved by the University;
- persons with an underlying medical condition which inhibits their ability to wear a mask or face covering;
- persons who are unable to place or remove a mask or face covering without assistance;
- persons who are being accommodated under the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2005, or persons who require accommodation in accordance with the Ontario Human Rights Code that precludes the wearing of a mask or face covering;
- York University departments and faculties may have specific practices which fall under provincial guidelines and/or operational requirements. For any questions, please contact <u>hsewb@yorku.ca</u>.

York University community members are not required to provide proof of any of the exemptions identified above. We ask that community members exercise discretion and patience should they observe a fellow community member not wearing a mask or face covering. In these cases, concerned individuals may contact:

- For staff/faculty Reporting manager or associate dean
- For students <u>oscr@yorku.ca</u>, Course Instructors.

Masks or face coverings may be temporarily removed while in an indoor area in the following circumstances:

- to receive services that require the removal of their mask or face covering,
- to engage in an athletic or fitness activity,



- to consume food or drink, or
- as may be necessary for the purposes of health and safety.

Signs have been posted at the entrances to all buildings reminding community members of the need to wear a mask or face covering while indoors. Please refer to the Frequently Asked Questions located at the YU better together website.
