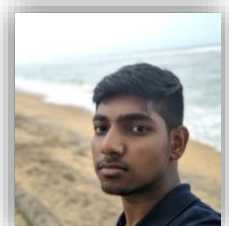
I am Umashankar Ketheeswaran, a second year student in IT. I am also a Technician/Marketing Associate for Tech Doc.
