Object-directed action: What's perception got to do with it?

Goodale & Milner (1992) suggested that visual control of action is separate from visual perception. Here I will present evidence that this notion is not entirely correct. In some specific situations, visual control of action depends on conscious perception; for example, this is true when the action requires memory for target features. I will also review evidence that supports the general idea that separate (but interacting) systems exist for perception in action in sensory modalities other than vision
