


University Professor



University Professor Description:

A professor is the leader of a higher education system that comes with an underlying amount of responsibilities. Educators must respect and abide by these responsibilities to uphold their title as an active University Professor within Post Secondary Education. Professors have the responsibility for preparing lecture materials, assessing students, while also educating a variety of courses to both undergraduate and graduate students within a certain field of study.

Step 1: Undergraduate / Bachelor's degree

Step 2: Master's degree

Getting a Master's degree should be the second step after deciding on the subject area you want to specialize in.

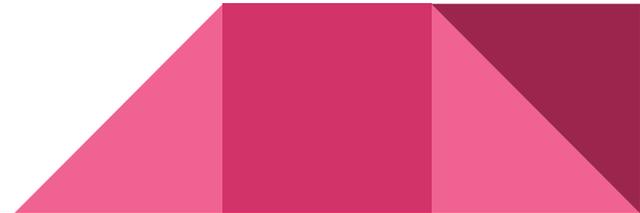
Step 3: Ph.D. Degree

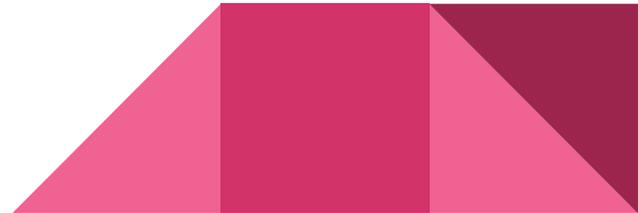
Advantages of Being a University Professor

- Always being able to brainstorm ideas and thinking constantly.



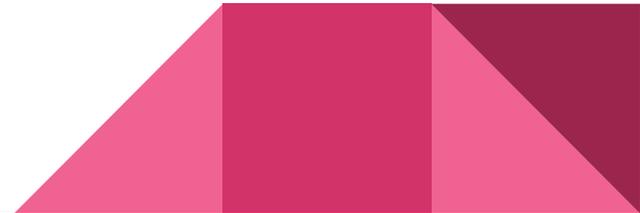
Responsibilities of a University Professor

- Evaluating students credentials, progress, learning and grades.
- Responsible for travelling to other universities as professors are invited to seminar talks, research centres to prepare projects with other professors.



Responsibilities of a University Professor pt.2


- Remaining professional, respectful and caring at all times towards both staff and students.

- Always acting as a role model, leadership, promoting teamwork, setting goals and remaining positive at all times.



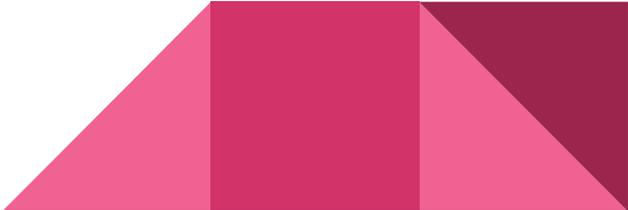
Demands

Comparison to Highschool Teacher with Professor (Education, benefits of Professor)

At any level, at its core teaching is about sharing and imparting knowledge some of the differences between professors and teachers are:

At a minimum, a bachelor's degree	Must have a masters, a phd and you must have a publication record
Many K-12 educators come in to teaching from other fields by earning a master's	Most four-year colleges and universities require a PhD for tenure-track positions
Teaching within a post-secondary setting, whether it's a technical school, community college, or four-year college or university and a master's in your field is considered the bare minimum that you'll need along with teaching or other professional work experience.	They may hire temporary adjunct instructors with only a master's degree. If you choose to pursue a tenure-track professorship, be prepared for a rigorous course of study that includes four to seven years of research and scholarship en route to earning your doctorate.
