

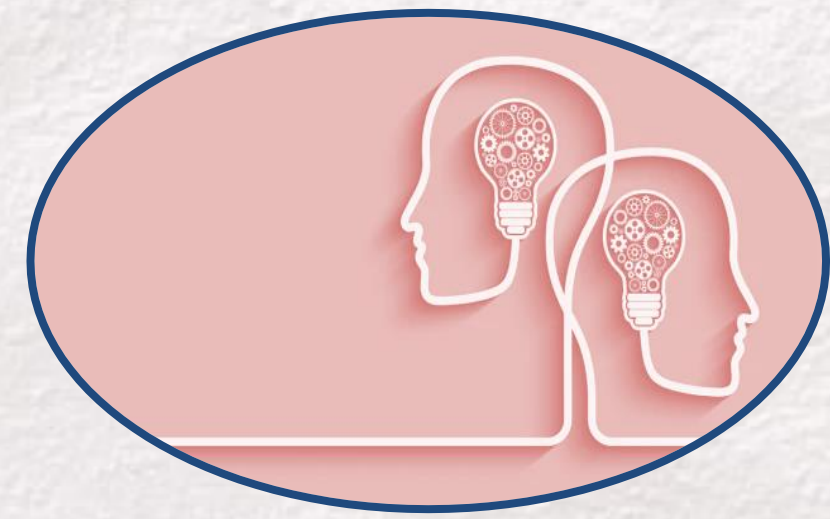

## Objective:

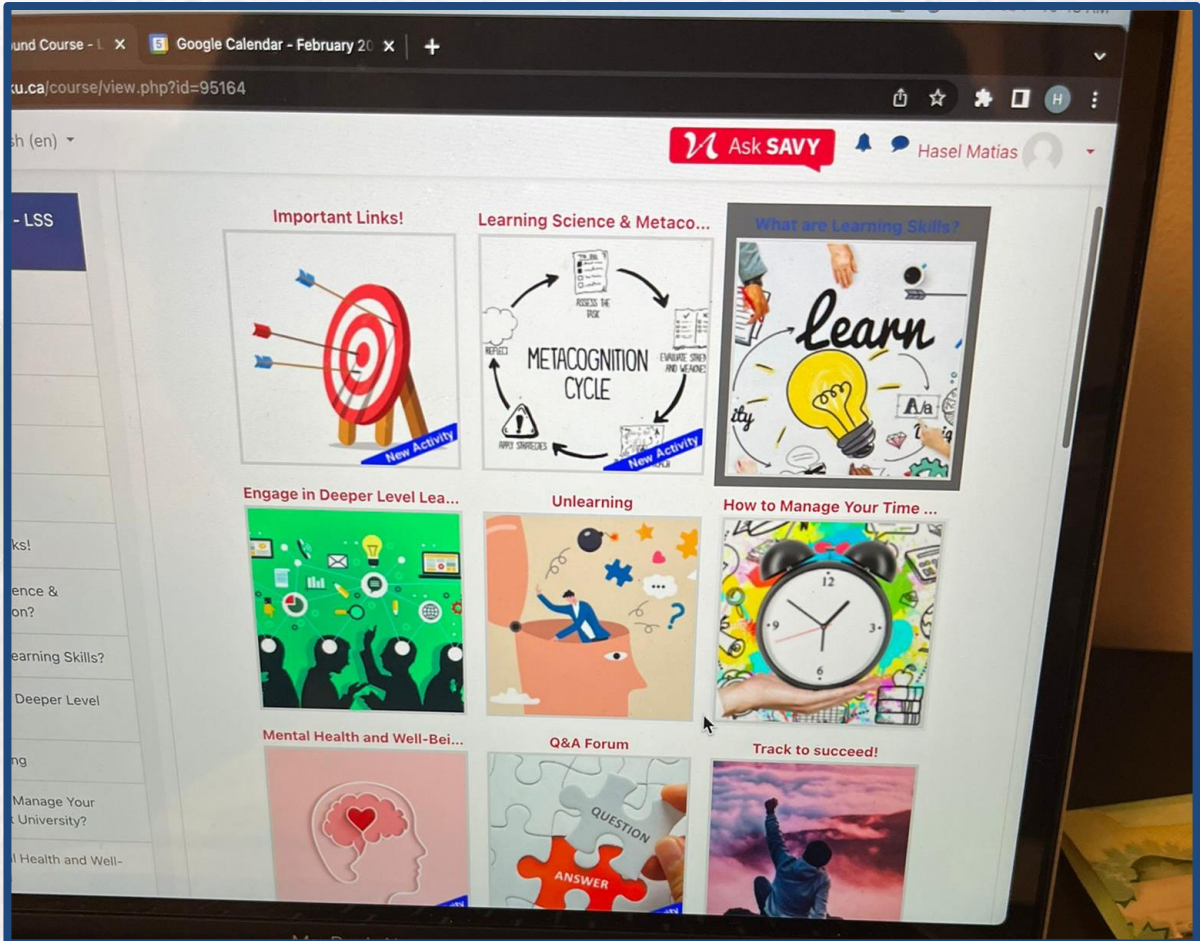
- ❑ Learning Skills Services is a department at York University that helps students achieve their academic goals by teaching research-proven study strategies and transferable skills.

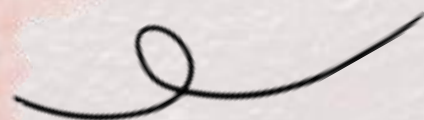
- ❑ Learning to unlearn

### Future Career:

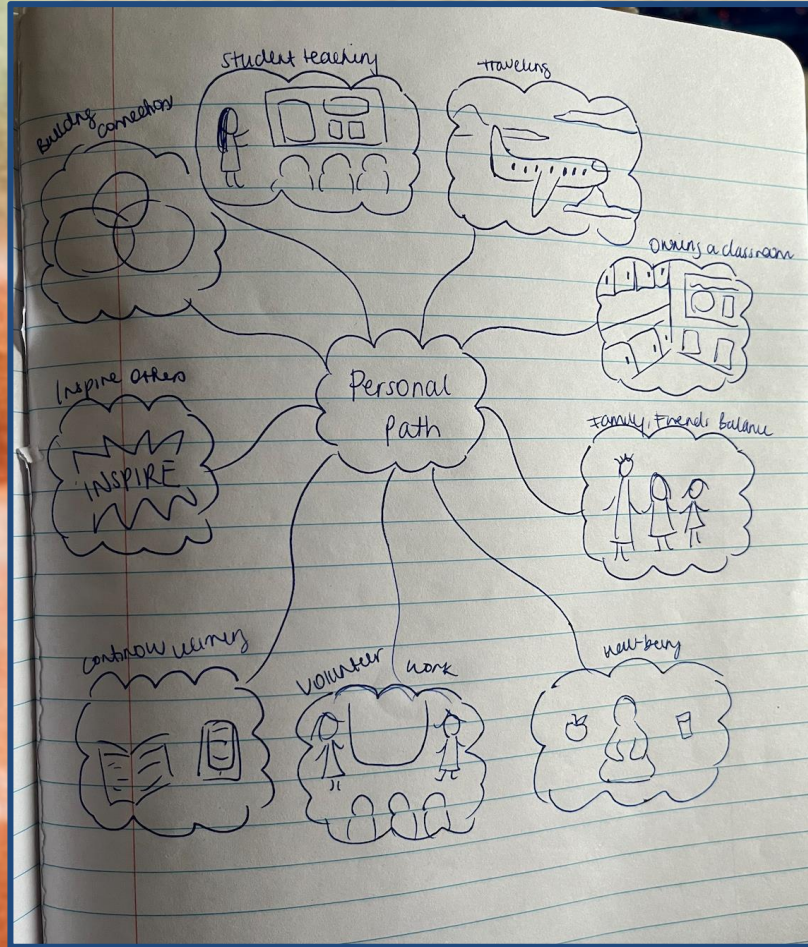
