

Seconded Faculty Positions

Apply now for Secondment in the 2021-2022 academic year.

The [Faculty of Education at York University](#) invites applications from practicing professional educators for seconded positions in our Bachelor of Education program for 2021-2022. The term of secondment is normally for a period of one year, renewable, for one or two years more (total length of term not to exceed three years).

Unless otherwise specified, positions are open to teachers at the following boards: Toronto, Toronto Catholic, Peel, Dufferin-Peel Catholic, York Region, York Region Catholic, Simcoe County and Simcoe Muskoka Catholic. Seconded faculty members may teach on Keele campus or at our other locations. Candidates can find further information about the Faculty of Education at <http://edu.yorku.ca/>.

We are looking to second teachers to fill the following positions:

- **Indigenous Education and PJI Generalist (2 positions)**

This position is at the Primary/Junior/Intermediate level and requires a strong background in Indigenous education, including Indigenous traditions, histories and ways of knowing. Candidates must have expertise in curriculum and instruction across subject areas at the elementary level with recent classroom teaching experience, and critical knowledge of the Ontario curriculum and its impacts on Indigenous identity and experience in schools. Consistent with its fundamental commitments to equity, diversity and inclusion, and to promote the recruitment and appointment of Indigenous faculty members, the University welcomes applications from all qualified Indigenous candidates for this position.

A seconded faculty member in the Faculty of Education at York University is expected to have current knowledge and experience and to have kept abreast of new directions in curriculum, pedagogical strategies and staff development as well as to have knowledge of the Ontario context in which elementary and/or secondary schools operate. Seconded faculty members are also expected to have demonstrated leadership in school settings, to possess skills in mediation, and to have an understanding of, and experience in, equity issues, issues related to social justice and the use of educational research, supporting English language learners, inclusive education, and technology as a teaching tool. They need to be motivated, involved and professional, and to foster motivation, professionalism and critical thinking in their students, who are the next generation of teachers.

The following activities may be a part of a seconded faculty member's responsibilities:

- Teaching courses (both on Keele campus and at other York locations) that prepare students in the theory and practice of education;
- Coordinating and organizing programs;
- Working collaboratively, problem solving, and team building with other seconded, tenure stream, and contract faculty members;
- Supporting student teachers in their practicum settings and monitoring their learning and development;
- Continuing to build on and strengthening existing professional partnerships with boards, schools and community partners;
- Participating in the daily operation of the Faculty of Education (e.g., standing committees, working groups, admission process, special projects);
- Collaborating with the Faculty in research projects and in designing, evaluating, and improving our teacher education programs; and
- Participating in ongoing professional development on issues relating to teacher education.
