

- A 3 to 4 year program (90 to 120 credits).

- Depending on your home country and/or high school curriculum, you may receive an exemption from submitting proof of English proficiency.



*Note: Please submit required documents within two weeks of submitting your application. Final transcripts are to be sent as soon as they become available.

How to apply

1. SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION

- Find your program and review all admission requirements at go.yorku.ca/intl2023
- Submit your admission application for multiple universities in Ontario at ouac.on.ca
 If you're only applying to York U, go to futurestudents.yorku.ca/requirements/apply

2. SUBMIT REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

After applying, you can submit required documents such as unofficial grades for conditional admission (if applicable) to our system, MyFile. Visit yorku.ca/glendon/future-students/applied for document information and submission instructions.

Admitted? Congrats! Here are your next steps:



Take a moment to celebrate, but don't forget these next steps.

1. ACCEPT YOUR OFFER

After you receive your offer of admission, you must accept it officially. If you applied to Glendon through OUAC, log in there to accept your offer. If you applied directly on the York website, log in to your MyFile portal to confirm your acceptance and book your enrolment appointment. Remember: the deadline to accept is on your admission offer letter.

2. APPLY FOR YOUR STUDY PERMIT

As an international student, you must obtain a study permit to legally enter and remain in Canada during your time at Glendon. Need help? No problem! York International hosts a series of free workshops and drop-in sessions to help you get started and navigate the process. yorkinternational.yorku.ca/immigrationoverview

3. APPLY FOR RESIDENCE

Fully immerse yourself in the on-campus experience by staying in one of Glendon's two student residences. They offer you the most convenient, supportive, and fun home away from home. Submit your residence application through MyFile before the May 1st deadline to secure your accommodations!
