This territory is subject of the Dish with One Spoon Wampum Belt Covenant, an agreement to peaceably share and care for the Great Lakes region.

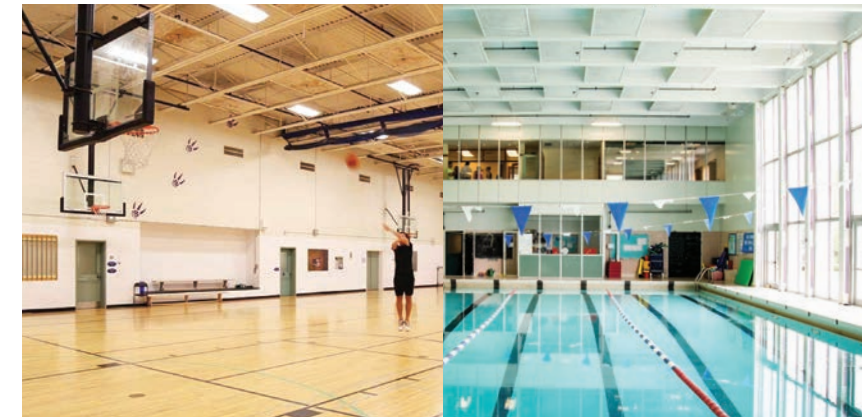


Your home away from home

Take it step by step

General admission requirements for US students

- Grade 12 graduation with a minimum overall average of “B” on Grade 11 and Grade 12 academic courses.
- SAT score of 1170 (SAT submission code: 0894) or ACT score of 24 (ACT submission code: 5250).
- SATs/ACTs are considered in combination with high school grades.
- Transfer credit granted for final scores of 4 or 5 on the Advanced Placement (AP) exams, depending on the program (maximum 30 credits, which is the equivalent of one year of studies).
- Prerequisite requirements correspond to junior/senior level.
- **Decisions for Fall admission are made on a rolling basis, with the first round of offers going out in December.**

Take a moment to celebrate, but don't forget these next steps.

1. ACCEPT YOUR OFFER

After you receive your offer of admission, you must accept it officially. If you applied to Glendon through OUAC, log in there to accept your offer. If you applied directly on the York website, log in to your MyFile portal to confirm your acceptance and book your enrollment appointment. **Remember: the deadline to accept is on your admission offer letter.**

2. APPLY FOR YOUR STUDENT VISA

US citizens can typically visit Canada with just a passport in hand, no visa needed. But to stay here as a full-time student, you'll need to apply for a study permit from the Canadian Government. Need help? No problem!

York International hosts a free series of workshops and drop-in sessions to help you get started and navigate the process.

3. APPLY FOR YOUR DORM ROOM

Fully immerse yourself in the on-campus experience by staying in one of Glendon's two student residences. They offer you the most convenient, supportive, and fun home away from home. Submit your residence application through **MyFile** before the **May 1st deadline** to secure your accommodations!
