



Open to all students, this hands-on incubator offers entrepreneurship courses, start-up hackathons, speaker events, and business competitions. Meeting You Where You Are

Think you have to speak French to study at Glendon? Think again!

While we believe that studying another language opens minds and doors, some students come to us with no prior knowledge of French, while others are multilingual. We're here to support your progression regardless of where you start and how far you wish to go.

Which path is right for me?

Our degrees are flexible, and so is your journey at Glendon. It doesn't matter if you speak one or several languages when you arrive—there's a pathway that matches your personal goals and supports your success. Choose the one that fits you best:

I don't speak French, or I don't wish to obtain a bilingual degree.

You'll complete just **two French courses** (6 credits) at any level, giving you more room to focus on your major. A wide range of programs offer that option.

RESULT: Glendon Degree with minimal language requirement

I want to graduate with a bilingual degree.

You'll complete **6 credits in French** (either in a French as a second language course or a course specific to your area of study that is taught in French). A quick assessment will help determine your starting point—either at the introductory level where you can build up your skills gradually, or at a more advanced level if you're already fluent.

RESULT: Glendon Bilingual Degree

Note: Are you interested to learn Spanish? We also offer a certificate of trilingualism English – French – Spanish. Speak to our academic advising team to select appropriate courses.

DID YOU KNOW?

Widely spoken in 165 countries, English, French and Spanish are the official working languages of large organizations. You can study these three languages, as well as Anishinaabemowin, at Glendon. In addition, 20 other languages are offered at York's Keele campus, a free shuttle ride away.

Employees who are bilingual in English and French are generally paid anywhere from 10% to 30% more in the local job market than unilingual candidates.

A worldwide focus on public health and environmental issues calls for more graduates who can work in the science professions, in increasingly multilingual and multicultural contexts.

If you want to have an impact on the world stage, it's increasingly critical to be able to conduct business in more than one language with people from various cultural backgrounds.

Accessibility & Well-Being



Indigenous & Spiritual Connections

Glendon sits on the traditional territory of many Indigenous Nations, including the Anishinabek Nation, the Haudenosaunee Confederacy, the Huron-Wendat, and the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation, who are the current treaty holders. We honour these relationships and continue to learn from them. York's Centre for Indigenous Student Services, located at the Keele Campus, offers welcoming, culturally grounded support, while the **Interfaith Centre** at Glendon provides a quiet, inclusive space for students and staff of all beliefs to pray, reflect, or meditate.

Inaugurated in June 2025, this bench/ sculpture by Secwépemc artist Tania Willard invites our students, faculty, staff, and community to engage in meaningful reflection, connection, and gathering. Rooted in Indigenous traditions and healing, it incorporates sage and tobacco in its concrete, symbolizing a powerful blend of culture, land, and community.

And when inspiration and creativity strike, Glendon gives you the tools to act on them. The **Glendon Digital Media Lab** offers space, equipment, and tutorials to explore and create digital experiences and bring your ideas to life. You can also sign up for an immersive technology bootcamp called Storytelling in Extended Reality.

Financial Aid

Your academic journey should be focused on learning, not worrying about finances. Our Student Financial Services team can guide and assist you with **OSAP**, scholarships and bursaries, financial literacy, budgeting, etc. If it involves funding your studies, we are here to help!

We offer **generous entrance awards** so you can focus on your goals, knowing we're invested in your success. With an **admission average of 80% or higher** (Canadian high school or CÉGEP), you can receive an entrance award that is renewable for up to four years:

Jun 2026

June 1, 2026: Deadline for Ontario high school students to accept their offer. As soon as you accept, book your enrollment appointment on **MyFile**.

OSAP Application: Apply for **OSAP** by **June 30** to ensure your funds are available in early September.

Summer Courses: Notify the Office of Admissions if you are enrolling in summer courses, as they may improve your grades, earn you extra credit or even fast-track your admission.

Final Transcript: Your final transcript is required in August.
