Master's Degree

What is the Master's Degree entail?

 The MA is a research degree that emphasizes the attainment of a basic capacity for critical research, analysis, academic writing and effective communication skills

Duration of the Program?

- o Full Time, 3 term, or 12-month, program
- September- August

Eligibility

- Usually applicants must hold a four year honour's undergraduate degree, or the equivalent
- Minimum GPA of B+ or above
- However, we consider extenuating circumstances, and relevant personal and professional experiences throughout the admissions process

PhD Degree

What is the PhD entail?

 A PhD/doctoral degree is an advanced research degree. It is the highest available academic degree granted by the University.

Duration of the Program?

Full Time, 5 year Program (3 terms each year)

Eligibility

- Usually applicants must hold a master's degree
- PhD programs look for a GPA of a B+/A- or above.
- However, we consider extenuating circumstances, and relevant personal and professional experiences throughout the admissions process

PhD Degree Requirements

Comprehensive Exams

- Comprehensive Examination #1- Theory
- Comprehensive Examination #2- Substantive (area of specialization that is related to the dissertation)

PhD Proposal

Topic approved by the student's supervisor and supervisory committee, and shall include submission and approval of a dissertation proposal, including appropriate ethics review (if applicable), and approval

PhD Dissertation

The doctoral dissertation must embody original work conducted while in program and must constitute a significant contribution to knowledge. It should contain evidence of critical understanding of the relevant literature. The material embodied in the dissertation should merit publication.

Required Documents

- Transcript(s) from all University level studies
 - Minimum B+ GPA
- Statement of interest (500 words)
- Resumé or CV
- Written work (maximum 5,000 words)
- Letters of Recommendation- 3 (2 academic and 1 additional/ employment)
- English Language Proficiency Test score (If applicable)
- Supplementary Information Form
 - Finding a Supervisor
 - Potential Research subject



Funding, Fees & Scholarships

Funding Packages

- A funding package is money given to you from the University, to help cover the costs of a graduate program
- Funding packages often fully neutralizes your tuition, and covers your health care costs
- All full-time students in eligible programs are automatically considered for a funding package
- Details of the funding package will be included in your offer letter.
- If you receive a funding package, you are welcome to apply for scholarships & bursaries as well, but those are separate from a funding package
