Graduate Program in Sociology Comprehensive Exam Reading List Social Theory April 19, 2023

Pedagogical Objectives

- To prepare students to teach in the areas of sociological and social theory
- To provide students with an opportunity to familiarize themselves with works that have shaped the ongoing development of sociological theory.

The two sections of this reading list cover:

- 1. Classical sociological theory, which is taken to include works that informed the establishment of sociology, together with representative theoretical texts of the founders of the discipline.
- 2. Contemporary sociological theory, which includes landmark texts from the second half of the 20th century that have had an enduring influence on the major schools of theory.

Instructions to students

This reading list has been designed to balance required readings with readings chosen by the student. Your final list must include:

- 1. At least three readings from the classical theory section of the comprehensive reading list and at least nine from contemporary theory section.
- 2. Additional readings from this list identified by the student in consultation with their comprehensive exam committee.
- 3. Reading chosen by the student that do not appear on this list (up to a maximum of 25% of your final reading list).

In total you should create a reading list consisting of the equivalent of 25 medium-sized books (5 journal articles or chapters = 1 medium-sized book). Students may choose individual chapters, or standard chapter-length excerpts, from the edited collections included in this reading list.
