#### York postdoctoral researchers receive prestigious Banting Fellowships

After a highly competitive selection process, York University Postdoctoral Fellows Chiara Camponeschi and Ashlee Christoffersen have been named among this year's recipients of the prestigious Banting Postdoctoral Fellowships. The award is open to scholars who are devoted to research in three areas: health research, natural sciences and/or engineering, and social sciences and/or humanities. Awarded by the Government of Canada, the Banting Fellowship is valued at \$70,000 per year for two years and supports postdoctoral researchers who will positively contribute to the country's economic, social, and research-based growth.
