Admission Requirements

- › To be granted standard admission to the program, applicants must meet two principal conditions:
- › First, candidates must successfully complete an aptitude test. The test measures candidates' aptitude for interpreting between English and another language, in large part by assessing their proficiency. However, the measures outlined below will also be used to assess language competence.
- › Second, they must hold an honors undergraduate degree or equivalent (typically a four-year full-time program) from an accredited postsecondary institution with a minimum grade point average of "B" in the final two years of full-time equivalent study. Applicants with a degree in translation are a good fit for the program, but so too are candidates with undergraduate training in other areas that have obvious relevance to interpreting, such as finance, economics, politics, public administration, law, and healthcare.
