## **Foundational Core Courses**

In order to assure that you achieve a solid foundation in Psychology, you must take at least one 3-credit course from each of two lists of courses (Social/Personality and Biological/Cognitive). Some of these courses have 2000 numbers; others have 3000 numbers. In general we recommend that you take courses with 2000 numbers in your second year, but you can take any of these courses in your second year if they don't have prerequisites (see below and prerequisite section of this website). These courses introduce you to the major areas within the discipline of Psychology. You should include two of these courses in your 2<sup>nd</sup> year program if possible, one from each list

## Group 1 "2100, 3100 courses" - Personality

- 3125 History of Psychology (not recommended until 3<sup>rd</sup> year)

## Group 2 "2200, 3200 courses" - Biological/Cognitive

- 2220 Sensation and Perception 1
- 2230 Motivation
- 2240 Biological Bases of Behaviour
- 3250 Neural Bases of Behaviour\* (*prerequisite PSYC 2240*)
- 3260 Cognition
- 3265 Memory (not recommended until 3<sup>rd</sup> year)
- 3270 Sensation and Perception 2\* (prerequisite PSYC 2220)
- 3280 Animal Behaviour

## 3290 – Psycholinguistics (not recommended until 3<sup>rd</sup> year)

In choosing these Foundation courses, be aware that many 4<sup>th</sup> year courses and some 3<sup>rd</sup> year courses have these courses as prerequisites, so you must plan ahead. All the *courses highlighted in blue are prerequisites* for one or more advanced courses. Be sure you think ahead and understand the prerequisite structure– don't be disappointed a year or two years from now!

**Specialized Honours program:** if you are a very strong student and are hoping to enter the Specialized Honours program you will need four courses from the Foundational Core (2 from each list), and it is a good idea to take most of these in your second year
