**General Description:** An examination of the genetic, physiological and anatomical bases of several types of abnormal behaviour.

**Prerequisites:** AK/AS/HH/SC/PSYC 1010 6.00 or AK/HH/PSYC 2410 6.00, with a minimum grade of C; AK/AS/HH/SC/PSYC 2030 3.00 or AK/HH/PSYC 2530 3.00; one of AK/AS/HH/SC/PSYC 2021 3.00, AK/AS/HH/SC/PSYC 2020 6.00, AK/HH/PSYC 2510 3.00; AK/AS/HH/SC/PSYC 2240 3.00 or AK/HH/PSYC 3145 3.00; AK/HH/PSYC 3140 3.00 (after Winter 2002) or AS/SC/PSYC 3140 3.00 or AK/HH/PSYC 3215 3.00. **Course credit exclusion:** GL/PSYC 3530 3.00 (after Summer 2010).

#### **Attendance:**

### **Assignment Submission:**

Students are responsible for keeping a copy (electronic or photocopy) of all the submitted work and a proof of submission. Late work will lose 10% for the first day and 5% for any subsequent day (out of its total value) per working day late.

Presentation: Students are required to prepare their PowerPoint presentation 10 days in advance of their scheduled presentation day and schedule a phone/meeting with the instructor. A failure to meet this deadline will result with a penalty of 10% for the first day and 5% for any subsequent day per working day late. The final paper deadline: 4 weeks following the presentation.
