Course Description: This course is designed to introduce students to the study of human behaviour from a psychological perspective. Included in the topics covered will be the following: the science of behaviour, biological foundations of behaviour, sensation and perception, learning and adaptation, memory, language, intelligence, motivation and emotion, development over the lifespan, personality, psychological disorders and treatment, stress health and coping, and social behaviour.

Course Learning Objectives: The purpose of this course is to introduce students to the field of psychology. In addition it is hoped that students will develop appropriate study habits and critical thinking skills. Participation in the Undergraduate Research Participant Pool (URPP) will expose students to ongoing psychological studies at York University.

Pre-requisite or co-requisite: None

Course Credit Exclusion: AK/PSYC 2410 6.00 or GL/PSYC 2510 6.00

Note: A course grade of at least C (60%) in PSYC 1010 6.00 is a prerequisite for further studies in psychology.

Website: Make sure that you sign up for a Moodle account as soon as possible. Online go to moodle.yorku.ca and follow the instructions, you need to logon using your *yorku id and password*, once registered with Moodle you can then find all moodle websites associated with the courses you are registered in.

Evaluation: There are three parts to how your grade is generated:

- 1. Five in-class non-cumulative term tests (multiple choice questions). These tests sum equally to 85% of your grade.
- 2. Three Assignments worth a total of 11% of your grade
 - A. Completion of Course outline Quiz (details will be posted on Moodle) and the Academic Integrity Tutorial (with submission of evidence of a perfect score 10/10). Hardcopy due at the beginning of class on September 30th worth 3%.
 - B. Literature Review hunt Assignment (details will be posted on Moodle). Hardcopy due at the beginning of class on January 6th worth 5%.
 - C. Psychology in the real world Assignment (details will be posted on Moodle). Hardcopy due at the beginning of class on March 3rd worth 3%.
- 3. The last 4% is earned through research participation in URPP (see below).

Missed Test: You must notify me within 24 hours of the test date explaining why you missed a test by email (<u>hjenkin@yorku.ca</u>). Any missed test scores a zero. Note – it is strongly recommended that students do not miss any term test. There is no make up for a missed term test.

Optional cumulative evaluation: Any student may *request* to take an optional multiple choice *cumulative*

evaluation scheduled in the Winter exam period, if the student had appropriate documentation. This allows any missed term test content to be evaluated regardless which term test was missed. A student may also request to take the cumulative test if they can document that a specific term test is uncharacteristically different from their other tests. This request should be made by email to me (hjenkin@yorku.ca) by April 2nd and include detailed reasoning as to how the specific term test was unusual.

Documentation for a missed test due to illness: A York University Attending Physician's Statement form must be completed by yourself and healthcare provider (available on the course moodle site). This is the ONLY form of medical documentation acceptable in this course. A "doctor's note" is NOT sufficient.

IMPORTANT - To continue taking upper year Psychology courses **you MUST pass this course with a grade or 60% or better.** I only asses 96% of your course grade as 4% comes from URPP. Be aware that if you **DO NOT** complete URPP and score 60% on **ALL** other components you will end the course with 57.6% a D+.

URPP: Students in this course have an opportunity to earn up to 4% of their final grade by participating in research as part of the Undergraduate Research Participant Pool (URPP). For information on this, see http://www.psych.yorku.ca/urpp/ if you do not want to participate in research there is an alternate Paper Stream you must opt for that by September 30th).
