Summary of Where We Are

> We have an archaic student system that cannot provide data on waitlists

> Scheduling has been a pain point for a long time

> We are seeing "new" issues as a result of the classroom renewal project (one course that has multiple meetings in one week may not always be in the same classroom)



Ad Astra Report

> We have enough space to do what we need

Fridays are almost always free, even in the large RAC rooms (of which we have 6 centrally = 2 at 301-400 and 4 at 401-500) PSYC, KINE, NATS, CHEM, BIOL

We want to schedule keystone/degree requirements first and then everything is sent in as a keystone course

Recommendations: an academic scheduling policy which includes general guiding principles and agreed upon meeting patterns

> Meeting Pattern Analysis is on hold due to budget



General Guiding Principles

Meeting patterns – 3 hour time blocks are the most used but, we have many other variations and in any given time slot Ad Astra found that between 19-39% of classes are being offered outside the 3 hour time block

Reducing the number of meeting patterns

> Maximum Enrolment Targets

We have 47 meeting patterns but, we still have classes that are requested out of block – low priority for booking as a result

Faculty of Health - FW 2023/2024

> In FW23, the Faculty of Health scheduled 1,303 in-person meets on the Keele Campus.

- > Of those 1,303 meets, a total of 142 meets were scheduled "out of block" (11% of the in-person meets)
- > Here's the breakdown of "out of block" meets that requested RAC space versus non-RAC

Max. Enrol for Course Planning and Scheduling

- Max. Enrol numbers are used during planning and scheduling to ensure we have sufficient resourcing and appropriate room assignments
- > Artificially high Max. Enrol numbers, for courses that are historically low-enrolled, make it difficult to properly schedule and to have room assignments published in time for the start of the term
- > Here are some data on Health's actual enrolment as a percentage of their proposed Max. Enrol.
