Modes of Applying:	Online	Port of Entry	Details
Visa-required nationals	Yes	No	<ul> <li>Visa-required nationals DO NOT have the option to apply for a work permit at a port of entry (POE).</li> <li>You must apply online and obtain an approval letter called the <u>"port of entry (POE) letter of introduction"</u> that says that you're allowed to work in Canada.</li> <li>Please bring the "port of entry letter (POE) letter of introduction" with you when you travel to Canada.</li> <li>NOTE: Upon arrival, you will get your work permit at the POE.</li> </ul>
Visa-exempt nationals	Yes	Yes	<ul> <li>While we strongly advise to apply for your work permit before you travel to Canada, visa-exempt nationals DO have the option to apply at a POE.</li> <li>To apply at a POE, you must be a U.S. citizen/ permanent resident, or a national of one of the visa-exempt countries.</li> <li>You must apply for an eTA before entering Canada.</li> <li>NOTE: Please contact our office in advance for further guidance on whether you should apply online or at a POE.</li> </ul>
