Such courses fall into two categories: I) pre-18th century literature (from before 1700), and II) pre-20th century literature (from between 1700 and 1900). Students should fulfill this requirement within the overall number of credits required for their English degree. You must take at least $\mathbf{3 . 0}$ credits from time period I or time period II.
${ }^{2}$ In their first year, all students majoring or minoring in English must take EITHER the course sequence AP/EN 10013.0 and AP/EN 10023.0 OR one of the following introductory courses: AP/EN 11016.0 or AP/EN 11026.0 or AP/EN 1103 6.0. The following grade rules apply in order to continue in English: Minimum grade of D (50\%) in AP/EN 10013.0 (must be fulfilled before taking AP/EN 1002 3.0); Minimum grade of C (60\%) in AP/EN 1002 3.0; Minimum grade of C (60\%) in AP/EN 11016.0 or AP/EN 11026.0 or AP/EN 1103 6.0. Students may only count six credits from 1000-level English courses towards their major or minor program.
