Students should fulfill this requirement within the overall number of credits required for their English degree. You must take at least 3.0 credits from time period I or time period II.

²In their first year, all students majoring or minoring in English must take EITHER the course sequence AP/EN 1001 3.0 and AP/EN 1002 3.0 **OR** one of the following introductory courses: AP/EN 1101 6.0 or AP/EN 1102 6.0 or AP/EN 1103 6.0. The following grade rules apply in order to continue in English: Minimum grade of D (50%) in AP/EN 1001 3.0 (must be fulfilled before taking AP/EN 1002 3.0); Minimum grade of C (60%) in AP/EN 1101 6.0 or AP/EN 1102 6.0 or AP/EN 1103 6.0. Students may only count six credits from 1000-level English courses towards their major or minor program.
