¹Students majoring or minoring in English are required to take a minimum number of credits focusing on literature from before the 20th century. Such courses fall into two categories: I) pre-18th century literature (from before 1700), and II) pre-20th century literature (from between 1700 and 1900). Students should fulfill this requirement within the overall number of credits required for their English degree. You must take at least 3.0 credits from time period I and at least 3.0 credits from time period II.

NOTE: Students cannot use any Creative Writing Workshop courses towards their EN major/minor requirements. For a list of these courses, please refer to The Creative Writing website.

NOTE: Students may count up to a maximum of 6 credits from Category D (Popular Genres) towards their major/minor requirements. For a list of these courses, please refer to The Department of English website.

²In their first year, all students majoring or minoring in English must take EITHER the course sequence AP/EN 1001 3.0 and AP/EN 1002 3.0 **OR** one of the following introductory courses: AP/EN 1101 6.0 or AP/EN 1102 6.0 or AP/EN 1103 6.0. The following grade rules apply in order to continue in English: Minimum grade of D (50%) in AP/EN 1001 3.0 (must be fulfilled before taking AP/EN 1002 3.0); Minimum grade of C (60%) in AP/EN 1101 6.0 or AP/EN 1102 6.0 or AP/EN 1103 6.0. Students may only count six credits from 1000-level English courses towards their major or minor program.
