¹Students majoring or minoring in English are required to take a minimum number of credits focusing on literature from before the 20th century. Such courses fall into two categories: I) pre-18th century literature (from before 1700), and II) pre-20th century literature (from between 1700 and 1900). Students should fulfill this requirement within the overall number of credits required for their English degree. **You must take at least 3.0 credits from time period I or time period II.**

²In their first year, all students majoring or minoring in English must take EITHER the course sequence AP/EN 1001 3.0 and AP/EN 1002 3.0 **OR** one of the following introductory courses: AP/EN 1101 6.0 or AP/EN 1102 6.0 or AP/EN 1103 6.0. The following grade rules apply in order to continue in English: Minimum grade of D (50%) in AP/EN 1001 3.0 (must be fulfilled before taking AP/EN 1002 3.0); Minimum grade of C (60%) in AP/EN 1002 3.0; Minimum grade of C (60%) in AP/EN 1101 6.0 or AP/EN 1102 6.0 or AP/EN 1103 6.0. Students may only count six credits from 1000-level English courses towards their major or minor program.

Residency Requirement: a minimum of 30 course credits and at least half (50%) of the course credits required in each undergraduate degree program major/minor must be taken at York University.

Upper-level Requirement: at least 18 credits at the 3000 or 4000 level including 12 credits in the major.

1700-1900/Pre-1700 Requirements: Students must complete at least 9 credits in courses from Time Period I and II overall by taking either: (a) at least 6 credits from Time Period I and at least 3 credits from Time Period II, or (b) 3 from Time Period I and 6 from Time Period II.
