Minor Change Description: (e.g. what is the change requested, what does this change mean for the degree, certificate, etc.):

We are adding a new second year required course option, which will eventually replace the current second year required course (ANTH 2170 6.0). We are adding another cross-listed fourth year course in medical anthropology (ANTH 4570/SOSC 4145 3.00 The Brain, Self & Society) to the list of electives for the degree, and deleting those courses no longer taught or that are no longer appropriate (SOSC 3168 3.0) in Social Science, while adding one new

one. We are also adding two medical sociology courses based on the same methodology (institutional ethnography) and a fourth year placement course option through which students in the program can acquire a high impact experiential education option.

Academic Rationale for Change:

The changes being introduced are designed to ensure the medical anthropology minor remains focused on its ethnographic methodology so as to distinguish it from those courses offered in the interdisciplinary Health and Society program. Each of the proposed alterations is designed to ensure a progression in knowledge in applying this methodology. The new cross-listed course (ANTH4570 3.0/SOSC 4145 3.0 The Brain, Self & Society) provides a more intensive theoretical approach to mental health that builds on the third year elective, ANTH 3280 6.0 Anthropology and Psychiatry in Global Context. They are both medical anthropology courses.

Hi Albert,

Thanks for writing.

SOSC 3921 is a 6 cr. course, so it probably should not be cross-listed; it could be a DCE for your 3rd yr 3 cr. anthro course and for HESO students the 3rd yr anthro course would be a DCE for SOSC3921; both SOSC and ANTH could list both courses in the list of optional courses available for major credit with the DCEs noted [in the short run a note would need to be written to degree audit for those who HESO students who wish ANTH and vice versa].

Also while Denielle is planning to teach the course from an anthropological viewpoint, I am not sure that we can guarantee that will always be the case.

Good afternoon Peggy,

As I'm sure you've heard, the dean's office has confirmed to us that Denielle will be appointed 40% to Anthropology as of next year, which translates as 1 course. We have to submit our curricular requests to the RO next week, and I have my review with JJ, so need to resolve those issues quickly. I asked Denielle what she would like to teach and she indicated that she would like to teach ANTH 4570 3.0 (which is cross listed as SOSC 4145). The course will thus serve HESO students as program credit. She indicated that she was going to be teaching SOSC 3921 Indigenous Health and Healing. She also indicated that she would be teaching it from an anthropological perspective. We have a fourth year 3 credit indigenous health course as well. Would Social Science consider cross listing SOSC 3921 with Anthropology? That way, both courses would serve either program. Our 4th year course would then become the advanced issues version of the cross listed third year course, reducing chances of duplication of material etc.

Would this be agreeable?

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
