1) **Change to the Program Core** – It is proposed that SOSC 4040 6.00 be dropped as a requirement for the Honours BA program.

(2) **Change to the Program Core** – It is proposed that SOSC 1340 6.0 replace SOSC 1340 9.0 as a core requirement for the program.

(3) **Change in the Program Core** – It is proposed that the 3-credit statistics requirement be incorporated into the core program requirements rather than as a required non-program course.

(4) **Changes to the Environment Stream** – It is proposed that students in the Honours BA program be required to take SOSC 4048 3.0 (The Business of Fair Trade) or SOSC 4049 3.00 (The Business of Food and Farming) and that the offerings in the Environment Stream be more restricted at the 3000 level (for both the Honours BA and BA programs) and the 4000 level (for only the Honours BA program). It is also proposed that ENVS 2000 6.0 replaces ENVS 2100 6.0 as one of the two options at the 2000 level in the ENVS stream.

(5) **Changes to Stream Requirements** – It is proposed that the stream requirements for the Honours BA be reduced from 18 to 12 credits for each stream.

Academic Rationale for Change:

(1) **Change to the Program Core** – This change will reduce the required credits for the BUSO Honours degree by six credits, and bring the program requirements more in line with other programs. This change will better enable BUSO Honours majors to take complementary certificate programs (which may require up to 39 credits) or minor programs. Greater access to such programs is likely to improve retention rates in the BUSO Honours degree program, and improve the career prospects for BUSO graduates.

(2) **Change to the Program Core** – This change will increase the number of available non-credit hours to BUSO majors by three credits, with the same impact as in (1) above.

(3) **Change to the Program Core** – This increases the clarity of the program requirements for students.

(4) **Changes to the Environment Stream** – Currently the BUSO program does not offer any required courses in this stream. Moreover, a number of the courses on the list of options that students can take at the 3000 and 4000 level do not have a core focus on business. The proposal is to ensure that students in the stream take more courses that have a stronger emphasis on the relationship between business and the environment. The proposal that ENVS 2000 6.0 replace ENVS 2100 6.0 is required by the fact that ENVS 2100 6.0 has been retired (and replaced by ENVS 2000 6.0).

(5) **Changes to Stream Requirements** – Previous minor degree changes to the Honours BA program reduced the degree requirements from 72 to 60 credits. This was based upon a reduction in the number of credits required in each stream from 18 to 12 credits. Unfortunately, while the reduction in Degree Requirements (from 72 to 60) was incorporated into the calendar copy in the last degree change, the reduction in stream requirements (from 18 to 12) was not introduced into the calendar copy. As a result there is currently an incongruity in the calendar copy that needs to be fixed.
