- 2. Will the course include Aboriginal/Indigenous identity as either a module or field of study?
- 3. Will the course include component(s) from Aboriginal/Indigenous Peoples' language, history, cultural heritage, artefacts, or traditional knowledge?
- 4. Will the course engage Aboriginal/Indigenous communities (including reserves, territories, departments, or community organizations, etc.) on experiential education.

* The Constitution Act, 1982, section 35(2) defines Aboriginal Peoples to include all Indigenous people of Canada – Indians (Status, Non-Status or First Nations identified), Métis and Inuit people.
