In this workshop, students will be introduced to some of the challenges that online methods pose for qualitative research and strategies that can be adopted in addressing potential limitations. Students will be encouraged to raise questions and discuss problems related to their own work.

Dr. Christopher Kyriakides holds the Canada Research Chair in Citizenship, Social Justice and Ethno-Racialization with the Department of Sociology, York University, Canada. As a sociologist, he has worked in multidisciplinary teams, including in the area of Internet Studies, utilizing both online and offline research methodologies.

The RCPS Methods Clinic is a monthly workshop on various social science methods-related topics. Clinics are open to faculty and graduate students who have experience with the method identified, are currently practicing it, or are considering it. Depending on the topic and facilitator, the workshop may cover a brief introduction to the method, epistemological and ethics issues, some practical instruction and a discussion of tips, challenges and strategies.
