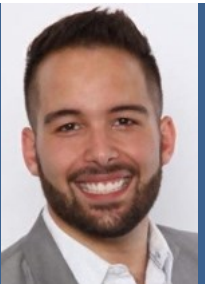


Ashley M. Cabral
