

## York University's Writing Centre's Multilingual Studio



The Multilingual Studio offers a safe space for multilingual students to develop their reading, writing, and critical thinking skills while engaging their multilingual abilities in enhancing their understanding of the genres and conventions of academic writing. Students meet once a week for two to three hours for 11 weeks to learn and practice reading and writing strategies, get expert advice on how to incorporate effective academic moves in their written work, learn alongside motivated peers, and exchange ideas and learn from each other.

Two sessions are available for the Winter 2021 term: Thursdays at 11:30 and Fridays at 1:30.

Our Studio is an inclusive, collaborative, and interactive space where our specialist instructor, Dunja Baus, uses a learning-through-doing experiential approach that promotes an active and critical appropriation of key academic literacies.

Perhaps the best tagline about The Studio's impact comes from one of its students, Jerzy Kluk. To him, The Studio is "the GPS to my Academic Success."

The incumbent will liaise with government regarding operational funding policy and also collect and disseminate key member statistical information within the Association membership.

#### **Content and Research Analyst - Ontario Association of Children's Aid Societies**

Under the direction of the Manager, Learning Development and Evaluation, this position will support all research initiatives at the OACAS with a focus within the educational services portfolio. This role will be responsible for developing, curating, and managing learning and research content related to Ontario child welfare policy and practice and perform both qualitative and quantitative research analysis, and deliver research findings and insights through various platforms. Using a lens informed by equity, anti-Black racism, anti-Indigenous racism and anti-oppressive principles, this position conducts environmental scans and literature reviews; researches, analyzes, and assesses resources on child welfare topics; and designs, maintains, and provides access to collections of child welfare resources.

#### <u>Director, Corporate Affairs Central and Western Canada - Ubisoft</u>

Representing Ubisoft's interests to government authorities, institutions and the business community, the Director - Corporate Affairs is primarily responsible for coordinating all of Ubisoft's corporate activities in these provinces. The Manager, Regional Partnerships:
