#### **Research Analyst - City of Toronto**

Reporting to the Supervisor, Economic Research, and the Research Analyst researches and analyzes economic and cultural data for policy development and to respond to investment and other enquiries. Collects, analyzes, interprets and maintains data about the Toronto economy and its cultural sector.

#### Research Associate, Political Behaviour of Citizens and Elites - Munk School of Global Affairs and Public Policy

The Policy, Elections, and Representation Lab (PEARL) in the Munk School of Global Affairs and Public Policy at the University of Toronto invites applications for a Research Associate (Limited Term) for a 1-year appointment. The anticipated start date is May 1, 2021. The Research Associate will manage the lab on a day-to-day basis and will report to Professor Peter Loewen, the Lab Director. The Research Associate will be responsible, in consultation with the Lab Director and collaborators, for leading research projects across a range of topics including but not limited to: the COVID-19-related attitudes and behaviours of citizens and political elites; the electoral performance of Canadian political candidates; public perceptions of the electability of political leaders in Canada and the United States; citizens' attitudes toward party leader debates in Canada; citizens' judgments of public figures accused of sexual misconduct; and citizens' preconceptions of politicians compared to individuals working in other professions.

#### Public Affairs and Policy Analyst - Association of Faculties of Medicine of Canada

The Public Affairs & Policy Analyst is a vital member of our operations team. Reporting to the Director, Operations and Strategic Initiatives, this individual plays an active role in conducting research, providing technical expertise, and engaging with stakeholders for a range of national-scale projects and initiatives of the Association of Faculties of Medicine of Canada. This position also works closely with the Manager, Government and Media Relations. While the head office is in Ottawa, remote work will be considered.

#### Research and Policy Intern - Ryerson Leadership Lab

#### Bilingual Senior Analyst, Official Languages - CMEC

The Bilingual Senior Analyst supports overseeing the development and progress of the work of the Official Languages unit, including the language-learning and exchange programs (i.e., Odyssey, Explore, and Destination Clic); the negotiation of the Protocol for Agreements for Minority-Language Education and Second-Language Instruction; and the pan-Canadian projects of two committees: the French as a First Language Consortium Committee and the French as a Second Language Consortium Committee. This role will appeal to individuals with strong research and writing skills (to produce briefing notes, discussion/reflection papers, and reports for a range of stakeholders, including deputy ministers and ministers of education), with the intellectual curiosity and rigour to monitor and investigate emerging developments in education in Canada and internationally, and the ability to make the appropriate linkages with topics discussed at expert and ministerial meetings. The analyst reports directly to the Coordinator, Official Languages, and works closely with a team of analysts and administrative professionals.

#### <u>Director, Government and Community Relations - City of Hamilton</u>

Reporting to the City Manager, and supporting the Senior Leadership Team (SLT), your primary responsibility as Director,
Government & Community Relations will be to oversee and direct the City of Hamilton's intergovernmental relations,
community relations activities including Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (EDI) strategies as well as the Community Enrichment
Fund, and corporate adherence to the City's Public Engagement policy. This key role will lead the City's government relations
strategies with direct oversight of government and stakeholder relations, community initiatives, and the building of stakeholder
relations to advance EDI in the community.

#### <u>Transportation Policy & Projects Specialist – York Region</u>

Reporting to the Manager, Transportation Strategy and Innovation is responsible for providing support to strategic policy programs, planning, development, evaluation and implementation and for coordination across the Department; monitoring developments, opportunities and trends that may impact the department operations/planning or policies; undertaking research and analysis to assess impacts of initiatives and the development of strategies and policies; providing project support to the Manager, and across the department; leading and executing program strategies to support Department projects associated with corporate and strategic planning; developing stakeholder relationships that foster collaboration and innovation; and preparing reports and presentations.
