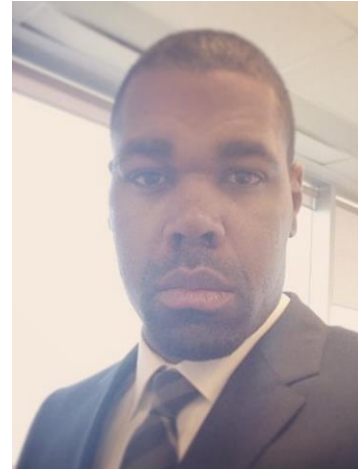

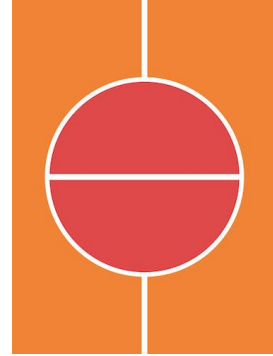

Is it the End for Refugee Protection?

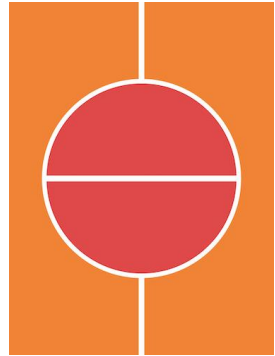
The global refugee protection regime is under attack as no longer 'fit for purpose'. Implicit in some of the more trenchant critiques is the contention that the underlying structure of refugee law has outlived its utility in articulating a shared vision of the fundamentals of refugee protection. Are we looking at the 'end days' of refugee law? The lecture offers a perspective on this topical question from a longstanding practitioner in this field. It begins by assessing several of the more critiques of the legal framework underpinning the refugee protection regime. It then asks whether the field of refugee law is itself well-placed to help in articulating a new shared global vision of refugee protection.



Professor David James Cantor

Professor David James CANTOR, PhD, is founder and Director of the [Refugee Law Initiative](#), School of Advanced Study, University of London, UK.

David researches on the legal and practical protection of refugees and IDPs and has published widely in books and peer-review journals. His extensive field research across Latin America, including in Colombia, El Salvador, Honduras, Guatemala and Mexico, won the *Times Higher Education* Research of the Year Award in 2017-18. He has advised and trained governments from Africa, Asia, Caribbean, Europe and Latin America, and was seconded to the UNHCR Americas Bureau as its Principal Advisor in 2018. David is current Editor-in-Chief of the [Refugee Survey Quarterly](#) journal and the Brill [International Refugee Law book series](#). He also co-founded the first and only distance-learning [MA in Refugee Protection and Forced Migration Studies](#), with over 300 students from humanitarian practice all over the world. He established and chairs the University of London Refugee Law Clinic.

Increasingly international crimes are investigated and prosecuted by national prosecutors before domestic courts. The prosecution of war crimes, crimes against humanity and genocide is, however, complex. This is especially the case when done on the basis of universal jurisdiction (UJ) where offences have (allegedly) been committed by non-nationals abroad. Elies van Sliedregt will discuss some poignant domestic cases of international crimes prosecution and highlight controversies around the exercise UJ.



Professor Elies van Sliedregt

Elies van Sliedregt is Professor of Law at Leeds University and Director of its Centre of Criminal Justice Studies (CCJS). Previously she was professor of criminal law at the Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam and Dean of the Faculty of Law from 2011 to 2015. In 2010, she was visiting professional with Chambers at the International Criminal Court. She was the 2015 Holding Redlich fellow at the Castan Center for Human Rights at Monash University, Melbourne and was appointed Fellow of McLaughlin College, York University, Toronto in 2018. Elies is senior editor of the Leiden Journal of International Law and member of the Royal Holland Society of Sciences and Humanities. She has published extensively in the field of international, European and comparative criminal law.

The [Advanced Policy Analyst Program](#) (APAP) is a challenging three year professional and leadership development program designed to develop economic and public policy analysts. It offers recent master's level graduates an unparalleled opportunity in the federal public service.

About the program

In Year 1 and 2 of the APAP, participants gain knowledge and first-hand experience by rotating through a series of four challenging six-month placements across the three central agencies—the Privy Council Office, the Department of Finance, and the Treasury Board Secretariat—and a line department in the National Capital Region (typically the participant's sponsoring department).

Successful applicants will have the opportunity to work on fast-paced and engaging policy topics that have a real impact on the lives of Canadians. Throughout the process, participants will gain:

- an understanding of the Cabinet and parliamentary systems
- an understanding of the roles of central agencies and line departments
- exposure to the overall functioning of government
- exposure to a variety of policy areas and policy making
- exposure to the expenditure management process
- opportunities to hone soft skills
- an effective network of colleagues and program alumni across government

Who should apply

The program seeks highly motivated candidates who exhibit leadership and academic excellence, good judgment and analytical abilities, and a keen interest in Canadian public policy and governance.

Applicants must have recently obtained or be about to obtain a Master's degree from a recognized university in any discipline. Recently is defined as within the last two calendar years (2019 and 2020 inclusively).
