The mission of the Global Public Policy & Government Affairs team is to prevent, manage, and mitigate political, legislative, and regulatory threats to TikTok and to promote a political, legislative, and regulatory environment that supports growth and innovation for their business.

Bilingual Senior Specialist, National Housing Council Secretariat - CMHC

The Senior Specialist will be responsible for leading the Council's operations and policy work, including the preparation and delivery of Council meetings, briefing support for the Minister and Council members including Deputy Ministers, or any other activities requested by the Minister and members including matters of governance, recruitment, and members' training.

The Administrator directs the management of the financial and human resources of the Finance and Operations Division to deliver on operational and strategic mandates; ensures that all legal and reporting requirements are met; and monitors and controls expenditures and develops plans for future human and financial resource needs.
