**Requirement Checklist and Notes (To ensure graduation, each box must be checked 'completed')**

- Residency Requirement: a minimum of 30 course credits and at least half (50 per cent) of the course credits required in each undergraduate degree program major/minor must be taken at York University
- Upper-level Requirement: at least 36 credits at the 3000-4000 level. 18 credits must be at the 4000 level
- International exchange:** t least one full term abroad as a full-time student at one of York University’s exchange partners in Italy. Student should have completed [AP/IT 2200 6.00](#) before departure or have obtained permission of the department.
