Requirement Checklist and Notes (To ensure graduation, each box must be checked 'completed')

Residency Requirement: a minimum of 30 course credits and at least half (50 per cent) of the course credits required in each undergraduate degree program major/minor must be taken at York University.

Upper-level Requirement: at least 36 credits at the 3000-4000 level. 18 credits must be at the 4000 level

Cumulative grade point average of at least 5.0 and declared subject grade point average of at least 5.5

NOTE: For the **GENERAL EDUCATION** category, a minimum of 6.0 credits must be chosen from each of Humanities, Natural Science and Social Science. General Education courses are offered at the 1000 level. A maximum of 9 credits in Humanities and Social Science will count towards fulfillment of the General Education 21 credit requirements.
