Applications and nominations are invited for the position of **Director of the Global Labour Research Centre** for a term of five years, to begin July 1st, 2023.

ORU Description and History:

The Global Labour Research Centre (GLRC) was established in 2013 as a Faculty-based ORU, within the Faculty of Liberal Arts & Professional Studies. The GLRC engages in the study of work, employment, and labour, organizing its activities principally around a number of interrelated research areas, including the impact of the changing nature of work and employment on labour rights; the interrelationships between migration, citizenship, and work; gender relations in work and labour movements; the revitalization of workers' movements; and work and health. The GLRC is a hub for pan-university research collaboration with a community engagement model that encompasses a range of labour and community partners. Central to the vision of the GLRC is a commitment to expanding the field of work and labour studies. The Centre will undergo re-chartering in 2023-24.

Position Requirements:

Applicants are expected to be members of the full-time faculty at York University, and to have a distinguished record of relevant scholarship and research interests, as well as a record of positive interaction with community partners concerned with work and labour. The Director is expected to administer the financial, organizational, academic, and collegial activities of the ORU; to develop external funding sources; and to maintain an active individual and collaborative research program. The ideal candidate will be aware of and responsive to the needs of community partners in the sector, the role of undergraduate and graduate students and student training in the GLRC, and academic networks both within the University and beyond.

Stipend:

The successful applicant will receive an administrative stipend and the appropriate course load reduction as stipulated by the YUFA Collective Agreement. The Director of the Centre reports to the Dean of the Faculty of Liberal Arts & Professional Studies.

Applicants are also asked to submit a statement of 2-3 pages about their vision for the Centre, including goals, objectives, strategy of action, and leadership style.
