

Wenona Giles is Professor Emerita and Senior Scholar in the Anthropology Department and Resident Research Associate at the Centre for Refugee Studies. She taught at York University for over twenty-five years and published in the areas of gender, forced migration, globalization, migration, education, nationalism and war. She has led numerous research projects, funded by grants from SSHRC, Global Affairs Canada, the Swedish International Development Agency, Open Society (Soros), Ford, and MasterCard Foundations, as well as others. Among her projects, Giles co-founded and co-coordinated the International Women in Conflict Zones Research Network that led to comparative research in Sri Lanka and the Balkans; and founded and co-led the Borderless Higher Education for Refugees (BHER) project in the Dadaab refugee camps, Kenya. She is currently writing an historical novel centered in Persia and Britain in the early half of the 20th Century.
