York University Small Research Grant

As part of a March 2022 agreement between York University and the York University Faculty Association (YUFA), the University is providing an annual fund of \$1M to support research intensification and administration functions for faculty members.

What activities are eligible for support?

- Support for preparing grant applications and grant administration
- Support for organizing research, scholarly, or creative meetings and events
- Archival and library research
- Data collection analysis and support for transcription
- Research communications: web support, podcasts, videos, commentaries including The Conversation, translation
- Knowledge mobilization and community/industry engagement
- Support for manuscript preparation and research dissemination
- Updating CVs, including for on-line platforms such as ORCID and eCV
- Other research, scholarly, or creative activities approved by the Office of the Vice-President, Research & Innovation

Who is eligible?

All employees in the YUFA bargaining unit who do not have a Generic Cost Centre balance exceeding \$50,000 are eligible with the following condition:

• At least 75% of the total annual funding of this Fund will be dedicated and available only to employees working in the following Faculties: the School of the Arts, Media, Performance & Design ("AMPD"); the Faculty of Liberal Arts & Professional Studies ("LA&PS"); the Faculty of Education; the Faculty of Environmental and Urban Change ("EUC"); Glendon; and the Schools of Nursing and Health Policy and Management in the Faculty of Health.

How much funding is available?

Each eligible faculty member can receive up to \$5,000 annually.

Awarded funds will be allocated to a Generic Research Cost Centre.

How do I apply for funding?

Complete the Mach Form available <u>here</u> by midnight on the last day of the application window. Applications received after midnight will be moved to the next application window.

What is the application deadline?

There will be two application windows. However, funds will be distributed on a first come first served basis, subject to the dedication of at least 75% of total annual funding to the Faculties/academic units noted above, which may result in only 1 application window this fiscal year. For the current exercise, the two application windows are:

<u>Application Window 1:</u> For this exercise, Application Window 1 will run from November 1 to November 15, 2022. VPRI will begin to announce results of application review on December 15.

Application Window 2: If funds remain available, Application Window 2 will run from April 1 to April 15, 2022. VPRI will begin to announce results of application review on May 15.
