Indigenous Framework

1. Expand the role of the indigenous council
2. Increase the number of indigenous faculty
3. Enhance the recruitment and academic success of indigenous students
4. Expand indigenous programming and curricular offerings which explore indigenous life, cultures and traditions
5. Facilitate research that is a relevant to indigenous life, and respects indigenous approaches to knowledge and learning
6. Engage with indigenous communities to enrich
7. Establish spaces for indigenous cultures
8. Ensure that the perceptions and experiences of indigenous community members are reflected in the classroom, on campus and in university life
9. Develop and expand educational opportunities
10. Ensure the process for developing, implementing and evaluating this framework involves indigenous community members both within and outside the university



- ❖ Expanding student, faculty, and community access to *entrepreneurial programming* and to increase our innovation activities through Innovation York



Integrated Resource Plans (IRPs) Are Operational Plans


- Every Faculty and administrative unit has an IRP: <https://irpplans.info.yorku.ca/>
- They set out concrete steps being taken to implement academic plans, with measures of progress
- Align resources to those steps and actions (eg people's time, funding)
- Progress updated twice annually

Strategic Mandate Agreement (SMA)

York University's agreement with the Province about the mandate we are pursuing with the public funds provided to us through government grant.

Explains how York is advancing the Province's objectives for post-secondary education.

SMA3: 2020-25

➤ sets out:

- Our enrolment corridor over the next five years
- Our institutional strengths; and
- Targets on performance metrics that will guide government funding for the period 2020-25.

➤ Metrics fall into two categories:

- 1. Skills and Job Outcomes; and
- 2. Economic and Community Impact.
