Building Effective TA-Course Director Relationships for Enhancing Student Learning in LA&PS

Monday February 1, 12-1pm EST via Zoom

Do you have open, two-way communication with your course director (CD)? Are you looking for ways to further enhance communication with your course director, and prevent conflict?

In this webinar, participants will be individually filling out an activity sheet regarding what information and support they believe TAs should expect from course directors. Later, participants will try to collectively resolve a hypothetical conflict between a TA and CD related to course structure within small breakout rooms. This webinar will help participants identify the roles and responsibilities they have as TAs and how to fulfill those roles and responsibilities with the help of CDs to improve course structure and maximize student learning.

Pedagogical Methods of Writing Development Monday February 8, 12-1pm EST via Zoom

This workshop is intended to serve as an opportunity for learning and discussion about teaching students the skills and mechanics of writing. The goal is to broaden our teaching scope and practices, giving special attention to aspects of writing students most commonly struggle with, or student demographics that may need refined instruction such as ESL learners or those with disabilities. The webinar will involve a presentation of useful and/or under-discussed writing pedagogies, also allowing for participatory elements where attendees reflect on pedagogies that resonate with themselves.
