

LAST CHANCE to register - Caring to Teach: Supporting Student Transitions between Teaching and Learning Environments

In this fully online course, participants will explore considerations for helping students make a successful transition between online and face-to-face teaching and learning environments by focusing on caring teaching practices, including both instructor and student well-being.

Creating Virtual Escape Rooms for Teaching and Learning (Thursday July 29, 10am-12pm)

This workshop, facilitated by Assistant Professors in Nursing, Kristine Pedernal and Andria Phillips, will provide guidance on the creation of virtual escape rooms using free Google Workspace products. An overview of how escape rooms offer a virtual space for students to engage in active learning by finding clues and solving puzzles based on course content, foster communication and collaboration, and to demonstrate clinical judgment will be provided. Attendees will briefly participate in a virtual escape room experience solving a variety of puzzles related to priority-setting and problem solving and then be guided in developing their own virtual escape room.
