Toolbox

Reconciling student privacy with accessibility requirements presents a notable challenge in Hyflex teaching and learning. If you are recording your lectures in Zoom, there are some default settings that you may consider adjusting to optimize your recording.

Access your [Zoom account online](#), locate Settings -> Recording -> Cloud recording, and place a checkmark beside 'Record active speaker, gallery view and shared screen separately'. This immediately gives you the option of recording up to three videos, each with different focus and content, of the same event. Depending on which of the options (Active speaker, Gallery view, and Shared screen) and how many of them you tick off in the list, you can have a separate recording of the presenter (Active speaker), the participant profiles or video streams (Gallery view), and the presentation you share on-screen (Shared screen). This will maximize your flexibility to edit and post the recording that excludes your students' images, and opens up several creative ways to use and re-use existing content.
